Obtain your nursing degree as a registered nurse (RN)and pass the NCLEX exam. Obtain your RN license through your State Board of Nursing and begin practicing in pediatrics.



Seek your Certified Pediatric Nurse (CPN) credential from PNCB when you meet eligibility. As you grow in your pediatric care role, explore ways to get involved with data or technology related projects.



Explore membership in the American Nursing Informatics Association (ANIA) to network, find mentors, and seek out professional development opportunities.



Seek your Informatics Nursing Certification (NI-BC) from the American Nursing Credentialing Center.



Consider obtaining an advanced degree in nursing informatics.
