They apply pediatric-specific knowledge to oversee first aid, health screenings, common issues related to physical and emotional health, and more. For children with limited access to health care, school nurses play a key role as a connection to preventative and primary care. School nurses also provide support to children with chronic conditions and special health care needs, promoting equity in education. They make a difference through their work, ensuring health and safety to help all children achieve their full academic potential.

Career Steps



Obtain a nursing degree. Minimum licensure requirements vary by state, so be sure to check your own state and local requirements to practice.



Pass your nursing license exam. Apply for nursing licensure through your State Board of Nursing.



Gain experience providing care to school-aged populations.



Join the membership association for school nursing specialization: the National Association of School Nurses (NASN). Become active in your local chapter to network and seek a mentor.



Obtain specialized certification if you hold a bachelor's degree or above. Two good options include the Certified Pediatric Nurse (CPN) credential from the Pediatric Nursing Certification Board (PNCB) and the Nationally Certified School Nurse (NCSN) from the National Board of Certification of School Nurses (NBCSN).
